MINISTER'S MESSAGE

While everyone was amazed at all that he was doing, he said to his disciples, 'Let these words sink into your ears: The Son of Man is going to be betrayed into human hands.' But they did not understand this saying; its meaning was concealed from them, so that they could not perceive it. And they were afraid to ask him about this saying.

An argument arose among them as to which one of them was the greatest. But Jesus, aware of their inner thoughts, took a little child and put it by his side, and said to them, 'Whoever welcomes this child in my name welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me; for the least among all of you is the greatest.' John answered, 'Master, we saw someone casting out demons in your name, and we tried to stop him, because he does not follow with us.' But Jesus said to him, 'Do not stop him; for whoever is not against you is for you.'

- Luke 9:43b-50

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

This passage seems, among other things, to be about expecting opposition when speaking the truth, and about humility when deciding what the truth is and who possesses it.

In reading it I was reminded by a recent article by a Vancouver School of Theology faculty member (unfortunately I can't put my hands on it now) about the Principle of Charity. Put simply, it says that you should really seek to understand a point of view before subjecting it to critique, in order to arrive at the truth instead of merely your own preconceptions.

In this age of social media and instant outrage, maybe Jesus calls us disciples to apply the Principle of Charity: when we encounter a statement we disagree with, even an outrageous one, perhaps we are called to understand how it makes sense to the speaker. From there, we might proceed to questions like, "What is the need which is crying out here? What is the good that this person is trying to accomplish?"

If we stop a moment to consider the human behind the action or comment, we might discover a fellow would-be disciple, even if they would not name Jesus as their teacher. From that common ground, we might together discover that we are both seeking God, even if that person does not follow our own group of disciples. We might discover that we have more friends, and fewer enemies, than we all first assumed.
